*We donated **hundreds/thousands** of cards, stickers, craft items, etc. to Macon Resources.

* We donated **44.7 pounds** of pop tabs to the Ronald McDonald House in Springfield. That was great work since we increased our amount of tabs by **16.7** pounds from 2012! Remember, it takes about 1000 tabs to make a pound. Our donation to them helps keep the Ronald McDonald House **totally free** to the families. We also donated 30 Guest Chef aprons for people to wear when cooking for the guests. Our culinary skills were put to the test with the six lunches we cooked at the House last year. COMMUNITY VOLUNTEER HOURS (CVH)


