Volunteer Hours

As we begin a new year, I thought it might be good to review volunteer hours that you keep track of and report for HCE. A volunteer hour is an hour spent in <u>volunteer work</u> for HCE meetings, lessons, officer work, baking, helping at the Ronald McDonald House, etc. Hours can also be counted for any volunteering you do for other groups such as hospitals, schools, churches, 4-H, Project Linus, senior citizen centers, veterans, etc. Instead of having ½ hours, you may round up to the next hour, i.e. 1 and ½ hours of volunteer work can be counted as 2 hours. You CANNOT count hours helping family members or any time where you received pay for your work.

Our volunteer hours go to the Extension Office through University of Illinois Extension to help them with grants, funding, etc. When you record your volunteer hours you are helping MCHCE as well as Extension by proving what a worthwhile, dedicated group we have in Macon County. It shows the valuable services provided by our members and justifies the support we receive from the University of Illinois Extension Office.

It is important to keep track of your hours whether you use a calendar or the front of your MCHCE booklet. Try to jot them down as they happen instead of waiting until the end of the year to try to remember what all you did. Yes, **every member** is asked to submit a form to show their volunteer hours and activities for the year.

Remember, if you have questions or need help, please ask someone. We want to make this as easy as possible for you.

Family Issues

February is American Heart Month Love Your Heart on Valentine's Day and every day by incorporating 30 minutes or more of moderate exercise, such as walking, into your daily routine. This year the American Heart Association will strive to educate women on the silent symptoms of heart disease and heart attack, as men and women often experience heart attack and stroke in different ways. Heart disease is the No. 1 killer of women and is more deadly than all forms of cancer.

The American Heart Association's "Go Red" campaign puts the focus on women's heart health. When it comes to heart health, the focus should be on prevention. This goes for both men and women, and especially young adults. Regular physical activity, a healthy diet (more fruits and vegetables, whole grains), limiting fast and processed foods, as well as red meat, are heart healthy factors everyone should consider. They prevent common risk factors for heart disease, like high blood pressure. "Risk factors can creep up on you," a Heart Association spokesperson said. "People gain weight steadily after they turn 18."
