1 pound lean ground beef ½ c. diced onion ½ c. diced bell pepper 2 garlic cloves, minced

1 c. pumpkin ½ c. ketchup

1 T. Dijon mustard 1 T. apple cider vinegar

1 t. chili powder ½ t. paprika

½ t. salt pinch of cloves, nutmeg

and black pepper

1 yellow cake mix
