This is a summary of our collective activities for 2017. We made and donated a total of 294 pillowcases. The recipients were: Ronald McDonald House 183, Webster Cantrell Hall 54, Cunningham Children Home 30, and Hopedale Medical Center 153. We will continue to make pillowcases in 2018. There have been sewing days that we teach 4-Hers to make their own pillowcase.

We collected and donated 59.2 pounds of pop tabs to the Ronald McDonald House. I was amazed to learn that this house in Springfield receives approximately \$10,000 from all of the tabs that they collect. Of course, several organizations contribute, but doesn't this fact make you feel good about collecting these lowly tabs?

We gave \$114.00, 11 rolls of toilet paper, 10 juice boxes, 5 boxes of tissues, 4 bottles of spray cleaner, 2 toothbrushes, 4 bars of soap, 348 wipes, 75 snack bars, and 20 individual bags of chips to Child First. Ninety four of our 112 members volunteered 29,572.5 hours for 2017. Amazing!! Many of the units submitted their hours all at once. This helped me a lot

Perfect Chocolate Chip Cookies

- 1 ½ cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ cup butter, room temperature
- ½ cup firmly packed brown sugar (I use dark brown sugar)
- 6 tablespoons granulated sugar
- 1 large egg
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 ¼ cups semi-sweet chocolate chips
- ½ cup pecans

Preheat the oven to 350° F and line 2 baking sheets with parchment paper or spray with non-stick spray. In a medium bowl, sift the flour, baking soda and salt together. In another large bowl, using an electric mixer at medium speed, beat together the butter and sugars about 2 minutes until it is smooth. Add the egg and vanilla and mix on low speed until mixed in. Gradually add the flour mixture and mix in until just incorporated. Do not overmix. Add chocolate chips and pecans and stir with wooden spoon just until incorporated. Chill dough if it is warm. Using a small or large ice cream scoop or heaping tablespoon, drop the dough onto the prepared baking sheets, 6 to 8 per pan, depending on size you are making. Bake the cookies 1 sheet at a time, until the bottoms and edges are lightly browned and the tops feel firm when lightly touched. Small cookies bake 8 - 10 minutes. Large cookies bake 10 – 13 minutes. Let the cookies cool for 5 minutes on the baking sheets, then transfer the cookies to wire racks to cool completely. Makes 15 – 30 cookies depending on size.
