December is here already and it is such a busy time of the year. I missed the sales on Black Friday, so now I will be busy find that perfect gift for everyone on my list. Our December lesson was Christmas flower arranging. Candace Hart from University of Illinois Extension presented a great demonstration about making wreaths and flower arrangements. Candace made it all look easy as she showed us how to make our own bows. She said to use wired ribbon and make a figure 8 as you twist the ribbon. Use pipe stem cleaners to wrap around the center to attach it to the wreath or package. She also showed us and gave us the name of many greens and flowers to us to

make a wreath. The wreath that she made for us was beautiful. She also taught us to use 1 to 1 proportions for a flower arrangement. Put flower food, an aspirin, or lemon-lime soda in the water to keep the flowers lasting longer, be sure to check the water every day, and if the water is cloudy change it. Use cool water to start with, or if you want the blooms to open sooner, use warm water. Here are a couple of reminders for you: The Extension office will be closed December 24 thru January 1; volunteer hours are due by December 28 to Bonnie Lanham; the 2019 program books are ready to be passed out; meet at 9:45 sharp in front of the building for a tour of the Police Training Academy; January 28th is Sew Practical. RECIPE

Cherry Coffee Cake submitted by Bev Carmean

1 ½ stick oleo	1 tsp vanilla
1 ¾ c. sugar	4 eggs
2 ½ c. flour	½ tsp. baking powder
½ tsp. Salt	1 can cherry pie filling

Melt oleo, add vanilla. Set aside. Mix sugar and eggs, one egg at a time. Beat well. Add flour, baking powder and salt. Grease a 9 x 13" baking dish and four or spray with Pam. Spoon in batter and top with pie filling. Pour melted butter/vanilla mixture over the top of the batter and swirl. Bake at 350 for 45 to 50 minutes.

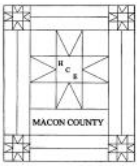
