Great Recipes

Zucchini Bread Bonnie Lanham

Bonnie says that she hopes everyone enjoys this recipe. It is the only recipe that she likes for zucchini bread!!!!

- In a bowl, place 3 eggs, 2 cups sugar, 1 cup vegetable oil and 1 tablespoon of vanilla. Beat till thick and lemon colored.
- Stir in 2 cups of grated, loosely packed zucchini.
- In another bowl, place 2 cups of flour, 1 tablespoon of cinnamon, 2 teaspoons baking soda, 1 teaspoon salt, and 1/4 teaspoon of baking powder.
- Mix the contents of both bowls together. Pour the mixture into 2 oiled and floured loaf pans.
- Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes to 1 hour. You may want to add 1 cup of chopped walnuts to the batter before pouring the batter into the pans.

In keeping with the theme of Italy for International Day, I discovered a recipe from Johnson County that sounds delicious! Italy is well known for lemons. So, here is the recipe for lemon yogurt bread.

Lemon Yogurt Bread Loaf

1 c. sugar 3 eggs 1/2 tsp. vanilla 1/2 c. oil

1 c. plain yogurt

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a loaf pan or a small bundt pan.

In a medium bowl, place yogurt, sugar, vanilla, oil and eggs and whisk. Slowly add the following ingredients: 1 1/2 c. flour, 2 tsp. baking powder, and 1/2 tsp. salt. Mix well using a mixer. Pour into a prepared pan and bake about 50 minutes for the loaf pan and about 35 minutes for the bundt pan. While this is baking, cook 1/3 c. lemon juice with 1/3 c. sugar in a saucepan till the sugar dissolves and the mixture is clear, set aside. When the loaf comes out of the oven, cool for 10 minutes. Pour the cooked lemon mixture over the bread and allow it to soak in.

When the loaf is cooled, remove it from the pan. You may also want to glaze it with a mixture of 1 cup powdered sugar combined with 2 tbsp. of lemon juice. Yummy!!! Enjoy!!!

FACTS ABOUT ITALY

Rome is over 2000 years old. Italy was ruled for 20 years(1925 to 1945) by Mussolini. Italy's last king ruled for only 36 days. Tourists throw over a million dollars each year in the Trivi Fountain. Italians who came to America in the early 1900's brought with them a way with tomato sauce and pasta that has had a great impact on American food choices. A few of the dishes they brought, spaghetti and pizza, have become standard American food. Yet these tomato-rich foods do not really typify Italy, as most Americans think. They only represent the cooking in the southern and central provinces from which many "first generation" Italian-Americans came from. Italian foods have an infinite variety and every region has its own dishes. This is determined in part by climate and terrain.
