## MACON COUNTY ASSOCIATION FOR HOME AND COMMUNITY EDUCATION PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGE

TO BE VOTED ON AT THE FALL MEETING, OCTOBER 11, 2023

The MCHCE would like to honor members of the association who have 50 or more years of service by amending the Constitution to say that such members will no longer have to pay yearly dues. The MCHCE treasurer will pay the state dues for their membership.

#### **CURRENT BYLAW:**

ARTICLE V-MEMBERSHIP Section 2. Dues

Dues shall be determined by the Board based on the proposed yearly budget. The budget shall be approved by the membership at the annual and/or special meetings. Dues shall be payable before December. The MCHCE YEAR is from January 1 through December 31.

#### PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGE (addition is in bold print)

ARTICLE V-MEMBERSHIP Section 2. Dues

Dues shall be determined by the Board based on the proposed yearly budget. The budget shall be approved by the membership at the annual and/or special meetings. Dues shall be payable before December 1. MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING WHO HAVE BEEN ACTIVE MEMBERS FOR 50 OR MORE YEARS WILL HAVE THEIR ANNUAL DUES WAIVED AND THE MCHCE TREASURER WILL PAY THEIR STATE DUES. The MCHCE year is from January 1 through December 31.

**District 3 Director:** Karen Cahill reminded everyone of the Mini District Workshop on June 28 and encouraged us to invite our unit members. This will be an opportunity to meet District 3 ladies. Included will be a mini lesson to pass on about the history of lemonade, door prizes and a variety of layered cakes and fruit.

Karen shared that in Fayette County, those who have been HCE members for 50 years or longer do not have to pay dues, as a way to honor them. Lyn Stevens will draft an amendment to change our Macon County HCE bylaws to do the same. The amendment could be printed in the August newsletter and voted on at our fall meeting.

Lyn moved that the following clarification about new members paying dues be made a permanent part of the minutes, with Cheryl Sample seconding the motion:

If a person is joining HCE between July 1 and October 31, they pay \$9 which is half the normal amount. That pays for the remainder of the year. They would then need to pay dues for the next year of \$18 by November 1<sup>st</sup>.

If a person is joining HCE in the months of November and December, they have the option of paying \$18 for the next year and be considered a guest for November and December. If they choose this option, their newsletters would not be started until the next year. Their other option is to pay \$9 for the remainder of the year and \$18 for the next year for a total of \$27. Regardless of when a person joins, dues are always due by November 1<sup>st</sup> for the following year.
