Pineapple-Coconut Braid

1 cup lukewarm pineapple juice*

For the bread:

2 pkg dry yeast

2 eggs, slightly beaten

1 tsp sugar

1 cup milk

Great Recipes



5 Tblsp sugar 2 tsp salt 6 (apprx) cups bread flour (or all-purpose flour) 4 Tblsp butter

*Pineapple juice – use juice drained from canned pineapple (used in the filling), or an 8-oz can of pineapple juice.

Add yeast and 1 tsp sugar to pineapple juice. Stir and let stand 10 minutes. Scald milk; add sugar and salt. Cool to lukewarm. Add to yeast. Add 3 cups flour and beat till perfectly smooth. Add melted butter, eggs and enough of the remaining flour to make easily handled dough. Knead well. Place in greased bowl. Cover and let rise in warm place until doubled, about 1 hour.

While the bread is rising, after about 50 minutes, prepare both fillings:

Coconut filling: 4 Tbsp salted butter 1 ½ cup sweetened flaked coconut ¼ cup sugar 2 Tbsp honey 2 Tbsp milk ¼ - ½ tsp almond extract (adapt to taste)

In a small saucepan, melt butter. Add the shredded coconut, sugar, honey, and milk. Cook for 2 minutes, stirring constantly. Remove from the heat and mix in the almond extract. Set aside to cool.

Cream Cheese filling:

1 8-oz. cream cheese, softened
1 8-oz crushed pineapple, drained
¼ cup sugar
1 Tbsp all-purpose flour
1 tsp vanilla extract

Whip together the softened cream cheese, crushed pineapple, sugar, flour and vanilla. When dough has doubled, punch dough down in bowl.

On a floured surface, use about 2/3 of the dough, and roll into an 8" x 15" rectangle. (Use the remaining dough to make cloverleaf rolls, or whatever your preference.) Cut a piece of parchment paper to fit a jelly roll pan or cookie sheet. Carefully transfer dough to pan or cookie sheet.


