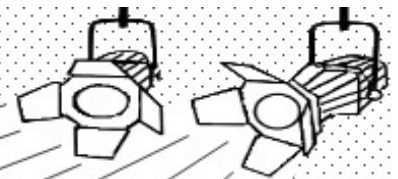

Great Recipes

Rock Springs requested that Lyn Stevens submit the recipe for Portillo's Chocolate Cake. Sounds yummy!!

COPYCAT PORTILLO'S CHOCOLATE CAKE

1 box Betty Crocker Super Moist Chocolate Butter recipe cake mix. (The Butter recipe cake mix is very hard to find. Lyn used a super moist mix.)

3 large eggs

1 cup ice water

1 cup Hellman's mayonaise

Pre-heat oven to 350 degrees. Grease 2 9" round cake pans. Beat all ingredients for 4 minutes until smooth. Pour in pans and bake 30 to 32 minutes. Cool on a wire rack for a good hour. Dust off any crumbs around the cakes for a smoother frosting. Frost with 2 cans of Betty Crocker chocolate frosting. Enjoy!!!

Sally Dennis sent the recipe that she took to the last sewing session. Several people asked for the recipe so here it is!!!

No Bake Pineapple Dream Dessert—9 by 9 inch pan

Filling

1 8 ounce package cream cheese, softened

1 c. powdered sugar

1 c. crushed pineapple, drained

1 8 ounce tub of Cool Whip

Crust

1/2 c sugar

1/2 c. melted butter

20 graham crackers, crushed

Topping

1/4 c. shredded coconut

1/4 c. diced drained pineapple

In a mixing bowl, mix the softened cream cheese until it is slightly fluffy. Add the powdered sugar, until well mixed together. Mix in the Cool Whip and beat till fluffy. Mix in the crushed drained pineapple. Set aside.

In a small mixing bowl, mix the crushed graham crackers, sugar, and melted butter until it is well mixed. Pat the graham cracker mix into the 9x9 inch pan. Spoon the filling mix over the crust. Sprinkle the shredded coconut and the diced pineapple over the top.

Put it in the refrigerator for about 2 hours. Yum!!!

Karen Cahill brought this salad to the last sewing day and several people asked for the recipe, so here it is!!!

Broccoli Cashew Salad with Apples, Pears and Cranberries

This is an easy and healthy recipe packed with fruits and vegetables.

INGREDIENTS:

5 c. Broccoli florets, chopped into small bites

1 apple that is cored and diced

1 pear (firm not soft) cored and diced

1/4 c. red onion, diced

1 c. cashews toasted or roasted

1 c. dried cranberries

CREAMY SALAD DRESSING

1/2 c mayonnaise

1/2c sour cream or kefir or Greek yogurt

2 tbs. lemon juice

1/4 c. honey, softened or warmed up

1/4 tsp salt

DIRECTIONS

In a large bowl, combine the broccoli, diced apple and pear and red onion, cashews, and dried cranberries.

In a small bowl, stir together the mayo, sour cream or kefir or Greek yogurt (whatever you have on hand) lemon juice, honey and salt. The honey should be soft and runny so that it will mix well. Whisk the dressing together until it is well combined. Add the dressing to the broccoli salad mix and stir well.

2nd Vice President: Lyn Stevens reported dwindling attendance at the library craft sessions. Attendees have enjoyed making the craft and listening to information on HCE. For 2024, 104 members have paid their dues, including three new members.

Community & Family Issues & CVH: Mary Ann Platt has received two thank you notes from Ronald McDonald House.
