## Apple Crisp for One

## Ingredients:

1 apple, peeled and diced

1 Tbs. butter, cut into cubes

2 Tbs. brown sugar

1 Tbs. cornstarch

1 Tsp. cinnamon

Pinch of nutmeg

2 Tbs. quick oats

2 Tbs. flour

## Directions:

Place diced apples in a microwave safe bowl with a cover. Microwave 1 minute. Add in sugar, cornstarch, cinnamon, and nutmeg. Stir to cover the apples. For the topping, combine the butter (softened), brown sugar, quick oats, and flour into a bowl and mix well with a fork, mashing all together. Sprinkle topping mixture on top of apples and microwave for an additional 2 minutes. Serve warm with vanilla ice cream and/ or caramel sauce.

#### New York Crumb Cake

Prep Time: 25 minutes Cook Time: 45 minutes Serves: 12 (9x13 inch pan)

#### Ingredients:

#### Crumb Topping:

2 1/2 sticks (10 oz.) unsalted butter,

1/2 C. granulated sugar

1 1/2 C. (packed) light brown sugar

2 Tsp. ground cinnamon

1/2 Tsp. salt

4 C. cake flour, leveled off

of measuring cup

Powdered sugar for dusting

2 C. all-purpose flour, spooned in to a measuring cup and leveled off

1 Tsp. baking soda

1 Tsp. baking powder

1/4 Tsp. salt

1 stick (4 oz.) unsalted butter, softened

1 C. granulated sugar

3 large eggs

1 Tsp. vanilla extract

1 C. sour cream

#### **Directions:**

Crumb Topping—In a large bowl, whisk together the melted butter, granulated sugar, brown sugar, cinnamon, and salt. Using a spoon, stir in the cake flour one cup at a time, until the mixture forms a cohesive dough, like a very thick and clumpy cookie dough. Add the last cup of flour, the mixture will be difficult to stir, so feel free to ditch the spoon and use your hands to mix it in. Set aside.

Cake—Preheat oven to 350 degrees and set the oven rack to the middle position. Grease a 9x13 inch cake pan. In a medium bowl, whisk together flour, baking soda, baking powder, and salt. Set aside. In the bowl of an electric mixer, beat the softened butter and granulated sugar on medium high speed, scraping the bowl as necessary, until light and fluffy, 2 to 3 minutes. Add the eggs one at a time, beating until incorporated after each addition (don't worry if the butter looks a little curdled at this point). Beat in the vanilla and scrape the bowl to make sure everything is evenly combined. Add the flour mixture alternating with the sour cream (half of flour, all of sour cream, rest of flour). Mixing on low speed with each addition, until just combined. Spread the cake batter evenly in the cake pan (it will only come up about 3/4 inch up the sides of the pan). Top the batter with the streusel crumb topping, using your fingers to break it apart and form it into roughly 1/2 inch chunks. Bake for 40 to 45 minutes, until a cake tester inserted into the middle of the cake comes out clean. Let the cake cool fully on a rack. Dust with powdered sugar and cut into squares to serve. Cover the cake with foil and store at room temperature; it will keep nicely for 3 days. To keep the cake fresher longer, store in the fridge, but bring to room temperature before serving.

Freezer friendly instructions: The cake can be frozen for up to 3 months. After it is completely cooled, wrap it tightly with aluminum foil or freezer wrap. Thaw overnight on the counter before serving.

Nora Reed is the new First Vice President replacing Sandy Severe.


