Yummy Recipes!

Fettuccine Alfredo

Ingredients:

- 1 stick butter
- 8 oz. block of cream cheese
- 3/4 C. parmesan cheese, grated
- 3/4 C. cream or milk
- 1 clove garlic
- Fettuccine noodles, cooked

Optional:

- Cooked chicken
- Cooked shrimp
- Spinach
- Parmigiano Reggiano cheese

Directions:

Melt butter and cream cheese into a sauce pan. Add in parmesan cheese, cream/milk, and garlic. Mix well while heating together. Add heated sauce to cooked fettuccine noodles and serve.

Ham Bites

Ingredients:

- 1 package sliced ham (2.5 oz) - finely chopped
- 1 small onion—finely chopped
- 1/2 C. shredded Swiss cheese
- 1 egg
- 1 1/2 Tsp. mustard
- 1/8 Tsp. pepper
- 1 can of crescent roll dough

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Mix ham, onion, Swiss cheese, egg, mustard, and pepper together. Lightly spray mini muffin pan. Unroll 1 package of crescent rolls. Cut into 24 pieces. Press dough pieces into muffin pan and fill with meat mixture. Bake for about 12 minutes.

CRAZY BARK

Ingredients:

- 1 20 oz. package white almond bark
- 16 whole chocolate graham crackers
- 1 C. pretzel sticks
- 1 C. broken chocolate sandwich cookies, like Oreos
- 1 C. gummy worms
- 1 C. gummy bears
- 1 C. sour gummy worms
- 1 C. roasted peanuts
- 1 C. candy-coated chocolates, such as M&M's
- 2 Tbsp. rainbow sprinkles

Directions:

1. Melt the almond bark in a double boiler. Stir until smooth, then allow to cool slightly.
2. Arrange the graham crackers on a rimmed baking sheet so that they are butted up against one another. Pour the melted almond bark over the top and use an offset spatula to spread it evenly over the surface.
3. Sprinkle on the pretzels, cookies, gummy bears, gummy worms, sour gummy worms, peanuts, chocolate candies, and rainbow sprinkles. Lightly press with the palm of your hand to make sure they are anchored. Refrigerate until completely set.

Comments from Toni: I have used this recipe many times, maybe twice a year, but always with my own variations. This works well with original graham crackers. I keep a container in the freezer for left over candies (all kinds) from holidays, home movie/game nights, gingerbread decorations from Christmas and Halloween, chips from cookie baking, etc. They stay great in the freezer for a year or so. When ready to make this, I thaw them and then chop into bite sized pieces to use. I also have a container in the freezer to hold left over chips, cookies, pretzels, crackers, etc. They stay fine for about 3 months. A little bit of toasted coconut tastes fine. Many kinds of cookie/cupcake sprinkles work. Leftover Candy Melts have been added to the almond bark to melt. We watch our 10 and 11 y/o granddaughters on weekdays when school is not in session. There are always 5 leftover goldfish crackers, chunks of cookies, broken candy canes, etc. left in the wake of their visits. Surprisingly, these leftovers are yummy, acceptable treats when used in this Crazy Bark. It makes them "new". I was shocked to find that a Junior Mint piece and a Sour Patch Kid piece tasted good on the same bark piece! I have used dried cranberries and freeze-dried raspberries powdered. I don't know how other fruits would work. Maybe candied lemon/orange peels or candied ginger? JUST GET CRAZY!!! In honor of the Olympics, I will be making a Crazy Bark with items the color of the Olympic Flag rings. I do have some Jolly Ranchers, M&M's, and Skittles to use. Who knows what else!
